Poet David Harsent's elegy to a tagged Hen Harrier is accompanied by Rob Godman's specially composed and haunting sound score. Ballerina Zoe Arshamian and Bowland itself celebrate female artistry in the dance and choreography and bears witness to the beauty of Hen Harriers in life and flight and the cruelty of their unwarranted persecution.

A Feast that Never Comes

How we build is how we grow and develop. It's how we establish a connection and define our history on this planet, and it's a reflection of our cultural times. We are building barriers and disconnection, wasting potential rather than feeding opportunity.

Speaking with industry-leading architects and designers and using the metaphor of a broken record, we explore trends, greenwashing, and our relationship with this planet and how we can make it a more substantial one.

This film was shot to preserve the dying bird culture of old Beijing in China. "Record it before it was gone". The birds that we are referring to in the bird culture are not the ones in cages, but the ones that can fly in the sky.
